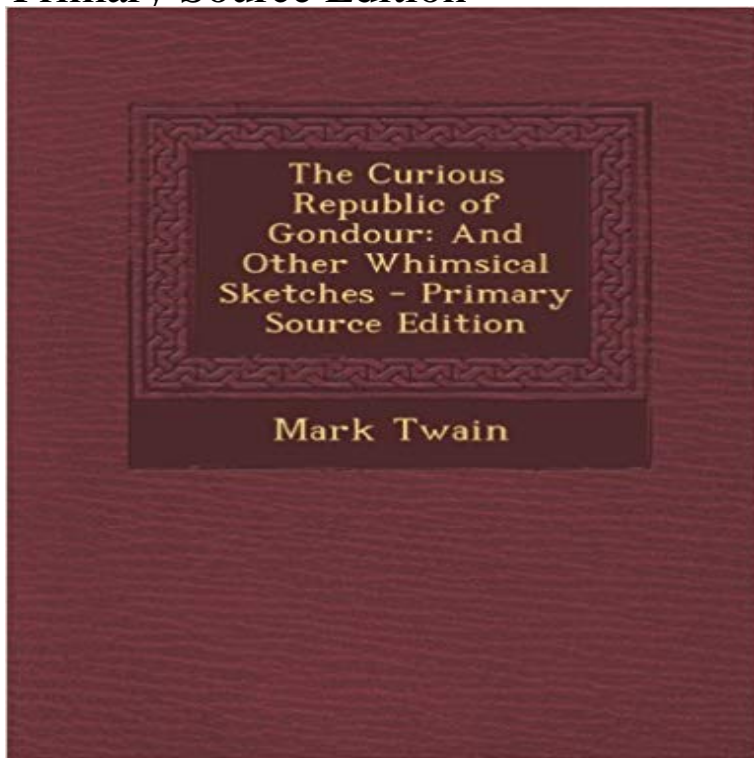


The Curious Republic of Gondour: And Other Whimsical Sketches - Primary Source Edition
